AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, 4 collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing 5 for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and 6 imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 penalties," in tax for education, further providing for 10 exclusions from tax. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 204 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, 15 No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by 16 adding a clause to read: Section 204. Exclusions from Tax. -- The tax imposed by 17 18 section 202 shall not be imposed upon any of the following: * * * 19 20 (69) The sale at retail or use of firearms on the exclusion
- 21 date by an individual purchaser. For the purpose of this clause,

- 1 <u>"exclusion date" means August 30 of each year. For the purpose</u>
- 2 of this clause, "purchaser" means an individual who places an
- 3 order and pays the purchase price by cash or credit on the
- 4 <u>exclusion date even if delivery takes place after the exclusion</u>
- 5 <u>date.</u>
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
