8	Section 1. Section 6105(a.1)(1), (b) and (c)(2) of Title 18

14	(1) A person convicted of a felony enumerated under
15	subsection (b) [or a felony under the act of April 14, 1972
16	(P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,
17	Device and Cosmetic Act, or any equivalent Federal statute or
18	equivalent statute of any other state,] who violates
19	subsection (a) commits a felony of the second degree.

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1 Any offense equivalent to any of the above-enumerated offenses under the prior laws of this Commonwealth or any 2 3 offense equivalent to any of the above-enumerated offenses under the statutes of any other state or of the United States. 4 Any offense under the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), 5 known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic 6 7 Act, or any equivalent Federal statute or equivalent statute of 8 any other state, that may be punishable by a term of 9 imprisonment exceeding two years. (c) Other persons. -- In addition to any person who has been 10 convicted of any offense listed under subsection (b), the 11 12 following persons shall be subject to the prohibition of 13 subsection (a): 14 \* \* \* 15 [(2) A person who has been convicted of an offense under 16 the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The 17 Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or any 18 equivalent Federal statute or equivalent statute of any other 19 state, that may be punishable by a term of imprisonment 20 exceeding two years.] \* \* \* 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 22

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
