Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous 2 articles, further providing for carrying firearms and for 3 licenses. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Sections 6106(b)(15) introductory paragraph and 6109(k)(1) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes 8 are amended to read: 9 § 6106. Firearms not to be carried without a license. 10 * * * 11 (b) Exceptions. -- The provisions of subsection (a) shall not 12 13 apply to: 14 15 Any person who is not a resident of this 16 Commonwealth and possesses a valid and lawfully issued 17 license or permit to carry a firearm which has been issued under the laws of another state, regardless of whether a 18 19 reciprocity agreement exists between the Commonwealth and the 1 state under section 6109(k), provided:

3 § 6109. Licenses.

4 * * *

5 (k) Reciprocity.--

- The Attorney General shall have the power and duty 6 7 to enter into reciprocity agreements with other states 8 providing for the mutual recognition of a license to carry a 9 firearm issued by the Commonwealth and a license or permit to 10 carry a firearm issued by the other state. To carry out this duty, the Attorney General is authorized to negotiate 11 12 reciprocity agreements and grant recognition of a license or 13 permit to carry a firearm issued by another state. An_ 14 agreement under this paragraph:
- (i) must provide that a license or permit issued by

 another state to an individual who is a resident of this

 Commonwealth is not recognized by the Commonwealth unless

 the individual also has a license issued by the

 Commonwealth; and

- 20 <u>(ii) is void if it does not meet the condition under</u>
