| 11 | (a) [Time and manner] <u>Manner</u> of delivery                     |
| 12 | [(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), no seller                 |
| 13 | shall deliver a firearm to the purchaser or transferee              |
| 14 | thereof until 48 hours shall have elapsed from the time of          |
| 15 | the application for the purchase thereof, and, when                 |
| 16 | delivered, the firearm shall be securely wrapped and shall be       |

(b) Duty of seller.--No licensed importer, licensed
manufacturer or licensed dealer shall sell or deliver any
firearm to another person, other than a licensed importer,
licensed manufacturer, licensed dealer or licensed collector,
until the conditions of subsection (a) have been satisfied and

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1 until he has:

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(1) For purposes of a firearm as defined in section 6102(relating to definitions) [, obtained]:

(i) Obtained a completed [application/record of 4 5 sale] and signed Form 4473 from the potential buyer or transferee [to be filled out in triplicate, the original 6 7 copy to be sent to the Pennsylvania State Police, 8 postmarked via first class mail, within 14 days of the 9 sale, one copy to be retained by the licensed importer, licensed manufacturer or licensed dealer for a period of 10 11 20 years and one copy to be provided to the purchaser or 12 transferee. The form of this application/record of sale 13 shall be no more than one page in length and shall be 14 promulgated by the Pennsylvania State Police and provided 15 by the licensed importer, licensed manufacturer or licensed dealer. The application/record of sale shall 16 17 include the name, address, birthdate, gender, race, physical description and Social Security number of the 18 19 purchaser or transferee, the date of the application and 20 the caliber, length of barrel, make, model and 21 manufacturer's number of the firearm to be purchased or 22 transferred. The application/record of sale shall also 23 contain the following question: 24 Are you the actual buyer of the firearm(s), as defined

under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6102 (relating to definitions), listed on this application/record of sale? Warning: You are not the actual buyer if you are acquiring the firearm(s) on behalf of another person, unless you are legitimately acquiring the firearm as a gift for any of the following individuals who are legally eligible to own a firearm:

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1 (1) spouse;

(2) parent;

- (3) child;
  - (4) grandparent; or

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(5) grandchild.

6 (1.1) On the date of publication in the Pennsylvania 7 Bulletin of a notice by the Pennsylvania State Police that 8 the instantaneous records check has been implemented, all of 9 the following shall apply:

In the event of an electronic failure under 10 (i) 11 section 6111.1(b)(2) (relating to Pennsylvania State 12 Police) for purposes of a firearm which exceeds the 13 barrel and related lengths set forth in section 6102, 14 obtained a completed application/record of sale from the 15 potential buyer or transferee to be filled out in 16 triplicate, the original copy to be sent to the 17 Pennsylvania State Police, postmarked via first class 18 mail, within 14 days of sale, one copy to be retained by 19 the licensed importer, licensed manufacturer or licensed 20 dealer for a period of 20 years and one copy to be 21 provided to the purchaser or transferee.

(ii) The form of the application/record of sale
shall be no more than one page in length and shall be
promulgated by the Pennsylvania State Police and provided
by the licensed importer, licensed manufacturer or
licensed dealer.

(iii) For purposes of conducting the criminal
history, juvenile delinquency and mental health records
background check which shall be completed within ten days
of receipt of the information from the dealer, the

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application/record of sale shall include the name,
 address, birthdate, gender, race, physical description
 and Social Security number of the purchaser or transferee
 and the date of application.

5 (iv) No information regarding the type of firearm 6 need be included other than an indication that the 7 firearm exceeds the barrel lengths set forth in section 8 6102.

9 (V) Unless it has been discovered pursuant to a 10 criminal history, juvenile delinquency and mental health 11 records background check that the potential purchaser or 12 transferee is prohibited from possessing a firearm 13 pursuant to section 6105 (relating to persons not to 14 possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer 15 firearms), no information on the application/record of 16 sale provided pursuant to this subsection shall be retained as precluded by section 6111.4 (relating to 17 18 registration of firearms) by the Pennsylvania State 19 Police either through retention of the application/record 20 of sale or by entering the information onto a computer, 21 and, further, an application/record of sale received by 22 the Pennsylvania State Police pursuant to this subsection 23 shall be destroyed within 72 hours of the completion of 24 the criminal history, juvenile delinguency and mental 25 health records background check].

26 (ii) Contacted NICS by telephone or electronically
 27 to request a background check on a potential buyer or
 28 transferee.

29 (iii) Received authorization from NICS to sell or
 30 deliver the firearm to the prospective buyer or

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<u>transferee.</u>

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2 (1.1) The dealer shall record the NICS transaction
3 number on Form 4473 and retain Form 4473 for auditing
4 purposes for purchases and transfers of firearms under
5 paragraph (1).

6 (1.2) Fees collected under [paragraph (3) and] section 7 6111.2 (relating to firearm sales surcharge) shall be 8 transmitted to the Pennsylvania State Police within 14 days 9 of collection.

(1.3) In addition to the criminal penalty under section 10 11 6119 (relating to violation penalty), any person who 12 knowingly and intentionally maintains or fails to destroy any 13 information submitted to the Pennsylvania State Police for 14 purposes of a background check pursuant to [paragraphs (1.1) 15 and] paragraph (1.4) or violates section 6111.4 shall be 16 subject to a civil penalty of \$250 per violation, entry or 17 failure to destroy.

18 (1.4) [Following implementation of the instantaneous 19 records check by the Pennsylvania State Police on or before 20 December 1, 1998, no application/record of sale] No Form 4473 21 shall be completed for the purchase or transfer of a firearm 22 which exceeds the barrel lengths set forth in section 6102. A 23 statement shall be submitted by the dealer to the 24 Pennsylvania State Police, postmarked via first class mail, 25 within 14 days of the sale, containing the number of firearms 26 sold which exceed the barrel and related lengths set forth in 27 section 6102, the amount of surcharge and other fees remitted 28 and a list of the unique [approval] transaction numbers given 29 pursuant to paragraph [(4)] (1.1), together with a statement 30 that the background checks have been performed on the

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firearms contained in the statement. The form of the
 statement relating to performance of background checks shall
 be promulgated by the Pennsylvania State Police.

Inspected photoidentification of the potential 4 (2)5 purchaser or transferee, including, but not limited to, a 6 driver's license, official Pennsylvania photoidentification 7 card or official government photoidentification card. In the 8 case of a potential buyer or transferee who is a member of a 9 recognized religious sect or community whose tenets forbid or 10 discourage the taking of photographs of members of that sect or community, a seller shall accept a valid-without-photo 11 12 driver's license or a combination of documents, as prescribed 13 by the Pennsylvania State Police, containing the applicant's 14 name, address, date of birth and the signature of the 15 applicant.

16 Requested by means of a telephone call that the [(3) 17 Pennsylvania State Police conduct a criminal history, 18 juvenile delinguency history and a mental health record 19 check. The purchaser and the licensed dealer shall provide 20 such information as is necessary to accurately identify the 21 purchaser. The requester shall be charged a fee equivalent to 22 the cost of providing the service but not to exceed \$2 per 23 buyer or transferee.

(4) Received a unique approval number for that inquiry
from the Pennsylvania State Police and recorded the date and
the number on the application/record of sale form.]

(5) Issued a receipt containing [the information from
paragraph (4), including] the unique [approval] transaction
number of the purchaser. This receipt shall be prima facie
evidence of the purchaser's or transferee's compliance with

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1 the provisions of this section.

2 Unless it has been discovered pursuant to a [(6)] 3 criminal history, juvenile delinguency and mental health records background check that the potential purchaser or 4 5 transferee is prohibited from possessing a firearm pursuant 6 to section 6105, no information received via telephone 7 following the implementation of the instantaneous background 8 check system from a purchaser or transferee who has received 9 a unique approval number shall be retained by the 10 Pennsylvania State Police.

(7) For purposes of the enforcement of 18 U.S.C. § 11 12 922(d)(9), (g)(1) and (s)(1) (relating to unlawful acts), in 13 the event the criminal history or juvenile delinguency 14 background check indicates a conviction for a misdemeanor 15 that the Pennsylvania State Police cannot determine is or is not related to an act of domestic violence, the Pennsylvania 16 17 State Police shall issue a temporary delay of the approval of 18 the purchase or transfer. During the temporary delay, the 19 Pennsylvania State Police shall conduct a review or 20 investigation of the conviction with courts, local police 21 departments, district attorneys and other law enforcement or 22 related institutions as necessary to determine whether or not 23 the misdemeanor conviction involved an act of domestic 24 violence. The Pennsylvania State Police shall conduct the 25 review or investigation as expeditiously as possible. No 26 firearm may be transferred by the dealer to the purchaser who 27 is the subject of the investigation during the temporary 28 delay. The Pennsylvania State Police shall notify the dealer 29 of the termination of the temporary delay and either deny the 30 sale or provide the unique approval number under paragraph

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1 (4).]

3 (g) Penalties.--

\* \* \*

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5 Any person, licensed dealer, licensed manufacturer (3) 6 or licensed importer who knowingly and intentionally requests 7 [a criminal history, juvenile delinguency or mental health 8 record check or other confidential information from the 9 Pennsylvania State Police] an NICS background check under 10 this chapter for any purpose other than compliance with this chapter or knowingly and intentionally disseminates any 11 12 criminal history, juvenile delinguency or mental health 13 record or other confidential information to any person other 14 than the subject of the information commits a felony of the 15 third degree.

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(b) Duty of Pennsylvania State Police.--

[(1) Upon receipt of a request for a criminal history, juvenile delinquency history and mental health record check of the potential purchaser or transferee, the Pennsylvania State Police shall immediately during the licensee's call or by return call forthwith:

(i) review the Pennsylvania State Police criminal
history and fingerprint records to determine if the
potential purchaser or transferee is prohibited from
receipt or possession of a firearm under Federal or State
law;

30 (ii) review the juvenile delinquency and mental 20130SB0448PN0394 - 9 - 1 health records of the Pennsylvania State Police to 2 determine whether the potential purchaser or transferee 3 is prohibited from receipt or possession of a firearm under Federal or State law; and 4

(iii) inform the licensee making the inquiry either:

6 (A) that the potential purchase or transfer is 7 prohibited; or

8 (B) provide the licensee with a unique approval 9 number.

10 (2)In the event of electronic failure, scheduled 11 computer downtime or similar event beyond the control of the 12 Pennsylvania State Police, the Pennsylvania State Police 13 shall immediately notify the requesting licensee of the 14 reason for and estimated length of the delay. If the failure or event lasts for a period exceeding 48 hours, the dealer 15 16 shall not be subject to any penalty for completing a 17 transaction absent the completion of an instantaneous records 18 check for the remainder of the failure or similar event, but 19 the dealer shall obtain a completed application/record of 20 sale following the provisions of section 6111(b)(1) and (1.1) (relating to sale or transfer of firearms) as if an 21 22 instantaneous records check has not been established for any 23 sale or transfer of a firearm for the purpose of a subsequent 24 background check.

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The Pennsylvania State Police shall fully comply, (3)26 execute and enforce the directives of this section as 27 follows:

28 (i) The instantaneous background check for firearms 29 as defined in section 6102 (relating to definitions) shall begin on July 1, 1998. 30

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(ii) The instantaneous background check for firearms
 that exceed the barrel lengths set forth in section 6102
 shall begin on the later of:

(A) the date of publication of the notice under section 6111(a)(2); or

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(B) December 31, 1998.]

7 The Pennsylvania State Police and any local law (4) 8 enforcement agency shall make all reasonable efforts to 9 determine the lawful owner of any firearm confiscated or 10 recovered by the Pennsylvania State Police or any local law 11 enforcement agency and return said firearm to its lawful 12 owner if the owner is not otherwise prohibited from 13 possessing the firearm. When a court of law has determined 14 that the Pennsylvania State Police or any local law 15 enforcement agency have failed to exercise the duty under 16 this subsection, reasonable attorney fees shall be awarded to 17 any lawful owner of said firearm who has sought judicial 18 enforcement of this subsection.

19 Establish a telephone number. -- The Pennsylvania State [(C)] 20 Police shall establish a telephone number which shall be 21 operational seven days a week between the hours of 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. local time for purposes of responding to inquiries as 22 23 described in this section from licensed manufacturers, licensed 24 importers and licensed dealers. The Pennsylvania State Police 25 shall employ and train such personnel as are necessary to 26 administer expeditiously the provisions of this section.] \* \* \* 27

28 [(e) Challenge to records.--

(1) Any person who is denied the right to receive, sell,
 transfer, possess, carry, manufacture or purchase a firearm

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1 as a result of the procedures established by this section may 2 challenge the accuracy of that person's criminal history, 3 juvenile delinquency history or mental health record pursuant 4 to a denial by the instantaneous records check by submitting 5 a challenge to the Pennsylvania State Police within 30 days 6 from the date of the denial.

7 The Pennsylvania State Police shall conduct a review (2)8 of the accuracy of the information forming the basis for the 9 denial and shall have the burden of proving the accuracy of 10 the record. Within 20 days after receiving a challenge, the 11 Pennsylvania State Police shall notify the challenger of the 12 basis for the denial, including, but not limited to, the 13 jurisdiction and docket number of any relevant court decision 14 and provide the challenger an opportunity to provide 15 additional information for the purposes of the review. The Pennsylvania State Police shall communicate its final 16 17 decision to the challenger within 60 days of the receipt of 18 the challenge. The decision of the Pennsylvania State Police 19 shall include all information which formed a basis for the 20 decision.

(3) If the challenge is ruled invalid, the person shall have the right to appeal the decision to the Attorney General within 30 days of the decision. The Attorney General shall conduct a hearing de novo in accordance with the Administrative Agency Law. The burden of proof shall be upon the Commonwealth.

27 (4) The decision of the Attorney General may be appealed28 to the Commonwealth Court by an aggrieved party.]

30 (i) Reports.--The Pennsylvania State Police shall annually
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compile and report to the General Assembly, on or before
 December 31, the following information for the previous year:

3 (1) number of firearm sales, including the types of 4 firearms;

5 [(2) number of applications for sale of firearms denied,
6 number of challenges of the denials and number of final
7 reversals of initial denials;

8 (3) summary of the Pennsylvania State Police's 9 activities, including the average time taken to complete a 10 criminal history, juvenile delinquency history or mental 11 health record check;] and

12 (4) uniform crime reporting statistics compiled by the
13 Pennsylvania State Police based on the National Incident14 based Reporting System.

16 [(j.2) Records check.--The provisions of this section which 17 relate to the instantaneous records check conducted by telephone 18 shall be applicable 30 days following notice by the Pennsylvania 19 State Police pursuant to section 6111(a)(2).]

(c) Revenue sources.--Funds received under the provisions of this section [and section 6111(b)(3) (relating to sale or transfer of firearms)], as estimated and certified by the Secretary of Revenue, shall be deposited within five days of the end of each quarter into the fund.

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(b) Source.--The source of the fund shall be moneys
 collected and transferred under section 6111.2 (relating to
 firearm sales surcharge) [and moneys collected and transferred
