AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 5 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 7 ending June 30, 2015; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight Fund 18 19 and the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted Receipt Account, to the Executive Department; to provide 20 appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 21 22 23 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2015, to June 24 30, 2016, for the proper operation of several departments of 25 the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized 26 27 to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 28 29 the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining 30 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

- 23 community development needs.
- 24 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services
- 25 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 26 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 27 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
