1 2 4 5 6 7	Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in Pennsylvania Game Commission, further providing for powers and duties of commission and for accountability; in hunting and furtaking, providing for senior hunting license holders; and, in special licenses and permits, further providing for authority to issue permits.

10	Section 1. Section 102 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
11	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:

13	Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
14	provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
15	provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
16	used in this title shall have the meanings given to them in this
17	section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

19	"Carrying capacity." The maximum number of animals of a
20	species that a habitat or ecosystem may support and sustain.

2	"Council." The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Council
3	established under section 328 (relating to accountability).

5	"Ecosystem." An ecological environment consisting of all the
6	living organisms, such as plants and animals, in the unit of
7	space, as well as all the nonliving, physical components of the
8	environment with which the organisms interact, such as air,
9	soil, water and sunlight. The term may be represented by a unit
10	of space, including a drop of water, lake, forest or mountain.
11	The term may include a wildlife management unit as described by
12	the commission.

1 fulfilling the duty, the commission shall focus primarily on serving the interest of sportsmen and the special heritage of 2 recreational hunting and furtaking in this Commonwealth. 3 \* \* \* 4 5 (c) Specific powers and duties.--In order to administrate and enforce this title, the commission through proper action 6 7 shall: 8 (1)Subject to section 2102(b) (relating to seasons, 9 possession, bag limits and devices), fix seasons, daily 10 shooting or taking hours, and any modification thereof, and daily, season and possession limits for any species of game 11 12 or wildlife[.], provided that the antlerless deer rifle 13 season may not exceed three days during a license year and 14 occurs only after the end of the antlered deer rifle season. 15 Remove protection, declare an open season or (2) increase, reduce or close a season. 16 17 Increase or reduce bag limits or possession limits. (3) 18 (4) Define geographic limitations or restrictions, 19 except that each county of this Commonwealth shall constitute 20 a separate wildlife management unit. 21 Fix the type and number of devices which may be used (5) 22 to take game or wildlife. 23 (6) Limit the number of hunters or furtakers in any 24 designated area and prescribe the lawful methods of hunting 25 or taking furbearers in these areas[.], except that the 26 annual number of antlerless deer permits shall be issued 27 according to each county-based wildlife management unit. Regarding deer management, the total annual number of 28 29 antlerless deer licenses that are allocated by the commission for each wildlife management unit shall be the number 30

3 (7) Govern the use of recorded calls or sounds or
4 amplified calls or sounds of any description for taking or
5 hunting game or wildlife.

6 (8) Add to or change the classification of any wild bird 7 or wild animal.

8 (9) Prohibit the possession, importation, exportation or 9 release of any species of birds or animals which may be 10 considered dangerous or injurious to the general public or to 11 the wildlife of this Commonwealth.

12 (10) Manage and develop its lands and waters and other 13 government or private lands and waters under agreement with 14 the owners as it considers advisable and, by proper action 15 and proceedings, enact and enforce regulations to insure the 16 prudent and proper use of these lands. In order to assist the 17 commission in performing its duties under this title, the 18 organization selected by the council under section 328(f)(4) 19 shall design a habitat enhancement program that benefits deer 20 and other forest-dwelling game and nongame species of 21 wildlife and that serves the interests of sportsmen for 22 recreational hunting, State camp lessee interests, the outdoor recreation interests of the general public and the 23 economic interests of rural communities and the outdoor 24 25 industry. The organization shall direct and facilitate the 26 development and maintenance of this habitat enhancement 27 program on State game lands and in State forests and the commission and Department of Conservation and Natural 28 29 Resources shall cooperate with the organization in expediting operations of the organization's habitat enhancement program 30

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## under section 328(f)(10).

2 Collect, classify and preserve such statistics, (11)3 data and information as in its judgment will tend to promote the object of this title and take charge of and keep all 4 5 reports, books, papers and documents which shall, in the discharge of its duties, come into its possession or under 6 its control. 7

(12) Take any necessary action to accomplish and assure 8 9 the purposes of this title.

Serve the interest of sportsmen by preserving and 10 (13)promoting our special heritage of recreational hunting and 11 12 furtaking by providing ample game and adequate opportunity to 13 hunt and trap the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

14 (14) Provide the maximum sustained yield of game for 15 sport hunting and trapping, including white-tailed deer, as prescribed by the carrying capacity of the ecosystem to 16 17 support and maintain respective populations of game.

18 (15) Enhance deer and wildlife habitat by increasing the

19 carrying capacity of the ecosystem for the maximum sustained

20 vield of game, including white-tailed deer, and for

optimizing densities of nongame species of birds and mammals. 21

22 Section 3. Section 328 of Title 34 is amended by adding a

subsection to read: 23

24 § 328. Accountability.

26 (f) Deer management accountability.--

(1) The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Council is 27

28 established to provide the General Assembly and the

commission with scientific data and management 29

30 recommendations regarding deer, wildlife, forest and habitat

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1	management. Recommendations of the council shall assist the
2	commission in performing its duties under this title, assure
3	commission accountability to sportsmen and provide the
4	General Assembly with the scientific and quality assurance
5	capabilities that are needed to ensure that the commission is
6	performing its duties under this title.
7	(2) The council shall consist of voting members,
8	composed of and appointed in accordance with the following:
9	(i) The Governor shall appoint a representative of a
10	Pennsylvania-based organization whose primary mission is
11	to serve the grassroots sportsmen of this Commonwealth by
12	providing regulatory relief and legislative help. The
13	appointee under this subparagraph shall serve as
14	chairperson of the council.
15	(ii) The Speaker of the House of Representatives
16	shall appoint:
17	(A) A representative of an organization located
18	in a county of the second class whose primary mission
19	<u>is to serve sportsmen.</u>
20	(B) A representative of a Pennsylvania-based,
21	nonpartisan organization whose primary mission is to
22	provide Pennsylvania gun owners and outdoors
23	enthusiasts with the information necessary to
24	understand individual rights under the Second
25	Amendment of the United States Constitution.
26	(iii) The President pro tempore of the Senate shall
27	appoint:
28	(A) A representative of an organization serving
29	and dedicated to preserving individual rights of gun
30	owners under the Second Amendment of the United

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1	States Constitution in counties of the second class
2	A, third class, fourth class and sixth class.
3	(B) A representative of a Pennsylvania-based
4	organization whose primary mission is to protect the
5	rights of State forest leased campsite owners and
6	associates in this Commonwealth.
7	(iv) The chairperson may appoint two additional
8	members to the council with recognized expertise,
9	knowledge and experience in a relevant field, who shall
10	be designated at-large members.
11	(3) Membership under paragraph (2) will be for a term of
12	six years and members may be reappointed.
13	(4) Council membership shall be voluntary and members
14	shall not receive compensation or reimbursement for expenses
15	incurred in the discharge of their duties.
16	(5) (i) Within 60 days of the effective date of this
17	subsection, the council shall select by a majority vote
18	of the members a Pennsylvania-based, private, nonprofit,
19	independent, scientific organization to be designated as
20	the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service.
21	(ii) The council shall enter into a contract by a
22	majority vote with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory
23	<u>Service.</u>
24	(iii) The council and the Forest and Wildlife
25	Advisory Service shall negotiate and agree to the terms
26	of the contract. The purpose of the contract shall be to
27	annually provide the scientific forest and wildlife
28	services that are set forth in this subsection. The
29	council shall determine the criteria to be used for
30	selecting the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service.

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1 Notice of the contract shall be given to the advisory

2 <u>service and the commission.</u>

(iv) The commission shall, under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I 3 (relating to Commonwealth Procurement Code), enter into 4 5 the contract, as negotiated under subparagraph (iii), with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service within 60 6 7 days of receipt of the council's selection. 8 (6) To ensure accountability, any contract entered into 9 under this subsection shall contain specific performance 10 measures that the council may use to evaluate compliance with the terms of the contract. If the Forest and Wildlife 11 12 Advisory Service fails to meet the performance measures, the 13 council shall, by a majority vote of the members, terminate 14 the contract and replace the Forest and Wildlife Advisory 15 Service. 16 (7) Provisions for payment shall be as set forth in an estimate or contract provided to the council by the Forest 17 18 and Wildlife Advisory Service and may be amended in writing 19 or supplemented with subsequent estimates for services to be 20 rendered by the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service if recommended by the council. The commission shall fund the 21 22 contract from any money appropriated or made available to the 23 commission. 24 (8) The Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall 25 conduct annual scientific assessments to determine the 26 condition of the forest and its capacity to sustain optimum populations of deer and other wildlife toward maintaining a 27 balanced ecosystem and the maximum sustained vield of deer 28 29 for sport hunting, and shall prepare an annual report that 30 recommends the total number of antlerless deer licenses that

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1	should be allocated for each wildlife management unit. The
2	Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall submit the report
3	to the council to assist the council in performing its duties
4	under this title.
5	(9) The council shall provide an annual report to the
6	Governor, the General Assembly and the Board of Game
7	Commissioners. The annual report shall include the council's
8	recommended number of antlerless deer license allocations for
9	each wildlife management unit. The commission shall post the
10	recommendation on the commission's publicly accessible
11	Internet website and in the commission's Pennsylvania Hunting
12	and Trapping Digest.
13	(10) To assist the council in performing its duties
14	under this title, specifically the duties under section
15	322(c) (relating to powers and duties of commission), the
16	Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service shall design a habitat
17	enhancement program that benefits deer and other forest-
18	dwelling game and nongame species of wildlife and serves the
19	interests of sportsmen for recreational hunting, State camp
20	lessee interests, the outdoor recreation interests of the
21	general public and the economic interests of rural
22	communities and the outdoor industry. The Forest and Wildlife
23	Advisory Service shall direct and facilitate the development
24	and maintenance of this habitat enhancement program on State
25	game lands and State forests and the commission and the
26	Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall
27	cooperate with the Forest and Wildlife Advisory Service in
28	expediting operations of the habitat enhancement program
29	under the precepts of the program.
30	Section 4. Title 34 is amended by adding a section to read:

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1 <u>§ 2321.1. Senior hunting license holders.</u>

A person who holds a valid Pennsylvania senior hunting 2 license may hunt and kill with an authorized weapon one deer 3 that has two or more points to one antler or that has one antler 4 three or more inches in length during an antlered deer season. 5 6 Section 5. Section 2901 of Title 34 is amended by adding a subsection to read: 7 § 2901. Authority to issue permits. 8 \* \* \* 9 10 (b.1) Deer management. -- Publicly owned lands within this\_ Commonwealth may not be included in any deer management 11 assistance program area established by the commission. 12 \* \* \* 13 14 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
