AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous 2 articles, further providing for firearms not to be carried 3 without a license and for licenses. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Sections 6106(b)(15) and 6109(k)(1) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 8 § 6106. Firearms not to be carried without a license. * * * 10 (b) Exceptions. -- The provisions of subsection (a) shall not 11 apply to: 12 13 14 Any person who possesses a valid and lawfully 15 issued license or permit to carry a firearm which has been issued under the laws of another state, regardless of whether 16 17 a reciprocity agreement exists between the Commonwealth and 18 the state under section 6109(k), provided:

- 1 (i) The state provides a reciprocal privilege for 2 individuals licensed to carry firearms under section 3 6109.
- 4 (ii) The Attorney General has determined that the
 5 firearm laws of the state are similar to the firearm laws
 6 of this Commonwealth.
- 7 (iii) In making a determination that the firearm 8 laws of the state are similar to the firearm laws of this 9 Commonwealth, the Attorney General shall compare only the provisions of section 6109(e)(1)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), 10 (v), (vi), (vii) and (viii) and (x), (xi), (xii), (xiii) 11 12 and (xiv) to the prohibitions contained in the other 13 state's laws. The Attorney General shall have no 14 authority to utilize other conditions for comparing the 15 other state's laws.

19 (k) Reciprocity.--

20 The Attorney General shall have the power and duty 21 to enter into reciprocity agreements with other states 22 providing for the mutual recognition of a license to carry a 23 firearm issued by the Commonwealth and a license or permit to 24 carry a firearm issued by the other state. To carry out this 25 duty, the Attorney General [is authorized to] may negotiate 26 reciprocity agreements and grant recognition of a license or 27 permit to carry a firearm issued by another state[.] and 28 shall do so where the laws of the other state are similar to 29 the provisions of subsection (e)(1)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii) and (viii) and (x), (xi), (xii), (xiii) and 30
