1 2 3 4	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, providing for firearm safety certificate and establishing the Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Chapter 61 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statues is amended by adding a subchapter to read:

1 <u>§ 6191. Legislative intent.</u>

2	It is the intent of the General Assembly to:
3	(1) Promote safe and responsible firearm ownership.
4	(2) Require persons who obtain firearms to have a basic
5	familiarity with and understanding of firearm use and
6	operation.
7	(3) Ensure that firearm owners understand the
8	fundamental legal aspects of firearm possession, carry and
9	use, including self-defense and the restrictions on the use
10	of deadly force.
11	(4) Ensure that firearm owners know and understand how
12	to safely store and handle firearms.
13	<u>§ 6192. Definitions.</u>
14	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	"Applicant." An individual seeking a firearm safety
18	<u>certificate.</u>
19	"Certificate" or "firearm safety certificate." A certificate
20	issued by the Pennsylvania State Police in accordance with this
21	subchapter indicating that the holder has successfully completed
22	<u>firearm safety training.</u>
23	"Certified instructors" or "instructor." A person certified
24	as a firearm safety instructor under this subchapter.
25	"Firearm." As defined in section 6102 (relating to
26	definitions).
27	"Firearm capable of being concealed upon the person." The
28	term shall apply to and include any firearm which is capable of
29	being concealed or in any way hidden or confined upon a person.
30	"Fund." The Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund established

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1	<u>under section 6195 (relating to issuance of firearm safety</u>
2	certificate and objective test, renewal, fees and expiration).
3	"Handgun." A pistol or revolver or other firearm capable of
4	being concealed upon the person.
5	"Law enforcement agency." The term shall include:
6	<u>(1) The Pennsylvania State Police.</u>
7	(2) A municipal police department.
8	(3) The Office of Attorney General.
9	(4) The Federal Bureau of Investigation or other Federal
10	law enforcement agency.
11	(5) A police department of another State or
12	jurisdiction.
13	"Law enforcement official." The term includes the following:
14	(1) The Attorney General and authorized employees.
15	(2) A district attorney of a county and authorized
16	employees.
17	(3) A Pennsylvania State Police trooper.
18	(4) A municipal police officer.
19	(5) A Federal law enforcement officer or agent who is
20	authorized to possess or carry a concealed firearm in any
21	jurisdiction in the United States.
22	"Written authorization." The verifiable written
23	certification from the head of a law enforcement agency by which
24	the purchaser or transferee of a firearm is employed,
25	identifying the employee as an individual authorized to conduct
26	the transaction and authorizing the transaction for the
27	exclusive use of the law enforcement agency by which that person
28	<u>is employed.</u>
29	<u>§ 6193. Firearm safety certificate.</u>
30	(a) Certificate requiredNotwithstanding any provision of
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1	this chapter or any other law or regulation to the contrary, a
2	person shall not:
3	(1) Purchase or receive a firearm, except an antique
4	firearm as defined in section 6118 (relating to antique
5	firearms) or a firearm which is a curio or relic, as defined
6	in 27 CFR 478.11 (relating to meaning of terms), without a
7	valid firearm safety certificate, except that in the case of
8	a firearm which is a handgun, an expired firearm safety
9	<u>certificate may be used.</u>
10	(2) Sell, deliver, loan or transfer a firearm, except an
11	antique firearm or a firearm which is a curio or relic under
12	27 CFR 478.11, to any person who does not have a valid
13	firearm safety certificate, except that, in the case of a
14	firearm which is a handgun, an expired firearm safety
15	<u>certificate may be used.</u>
16	(b) Exceptions to firearm safety certificate requirement
17	Notwithstanding subsection (a), the following persons shall be
18	exempt from the firearm safety certificate requirement under
19	subsection (a):
20	(1) A law enforcement official.
21	(2) An active or honorably retired peace officer as
22	defined in section 501 (relating to definitions).
23	(3) An active or honorably retired Federal law
24	<u>enforcement officer or agent.</u>
25	(4) A person who has successfully completed municipal
26	police officers' education and training in accordance with 53
27	Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police
28	education and training).
29	(5) A firearm dealer licensed in accordance with
30	sections 6112 (relating to retail dealer required to be

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1	licensed) and 6113 (relating to licensing of dealers) who is
2	acting in the course and scope of his activities as a
3	licensed dealer.
4	(6) An active or honorably retired member of the United
5	States Armed Forces or a reserve component of the United
6	<u>States Armed Forces as defined in 10 U.S.C. § 101 (relating</u>
7	to definitions).
8	(c) Certain exemption by operation of lawThe following
9	persons who take title or possession of a firearm by operation
10	of law in a representative capacity, until or unless they
11	transfer title ownership of the firearm to themselves in a
12	personal capacity, shall be exempt from the requirements of
13	subsection (a):
14	(1) The executor or administrator of an estate.
15	(2) A secured creditor or an agent or employee of a
16	secured creditor when a firearm is possessed as collateral
17	for, or as a result of, a default under a security agreement
18	under 13 Pa.C.S. (relating to commercial code).
19	(3) A writ server who is directed to execute a writ or
20	serve other court documents under 42 Pa.C.S. (relating to
21	judiciary and judicial procedure).
22	(4) A receiver performing the functions of a receiver
23	under the laws of this Commonwealth.
24	(5) A trustee in bankruptcy performing the duties of a
25	<u>trustee.</u>
26	(6) An assignee for the benefit of creditors performing
27	the functions of an assignee.
28	(d) Holder of hunting licenseA person who holds a valid
29	unexpired hunting license which was issued for the hunting
30	season immediately preceding the calendar year in which the

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1	person receives or takes possession of a firearm shall be exempt
2	from the requirements of subsection (a), except as to a firearm
3	which is a handgun.
4	(e) Law enforcement exemptionThis section shall not apply
5	to a sale, delivery or transfer of firearms made to a law
6	enforcement official representing a law enforcement agency for
7	the exclusive use by that law enforcement agency if, prior to
8	the sale, delivery or transfer of the firearms, written
9	authorization from the head of the law enforcement agency
10	authorizing the transaction is presented to the person from whom
11	the purchase, delivery or transfer is being made.
12	<u>§ 6194. Pennsylvania State Police.</u>
13	(a) Administration and enforcementThe Pennsylvania State
14	Police shall administer and enforce the provisions of this
15	<u>subchapter.</u>
16	(b) Duties of Pennsylvania State PoliceTo carry out the
17	provisions of this subchapter, the Pennsylvania State Police
18	shall:
19	(1) Develop a program for the certification of persons
20	to provide firearm safety instruction to individuals seeking
21	firearm safety certification in accordance with the
22	provisions of this subchapter.
23	(2) Develop a firearm safety manual and make the manual
24	available to firearm dealers licensed under sections 6112_
25	(relating to retail dealer required to be licensed) and 6113
26	(relating to licensing of dealers). Each firearm dealer shall
27	make the manual available to the general public. A firearm
28	dealer may make the manual available to the public by
29	including the manual or essential portions of the manual in a
30	pamphlet developed by the dealer that summarizes the
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1	<u>Commonwealth's firearms law, by posting the instructions</u>
2	manual or essential portions of the manual on the dealer's
3	publicly accessible Internet website or by providing a link
4	to the Pennsylvania State Police's publicly accessible
5	Internet website on the dealer's publicly accessible Internet
6	website.
7	(3) Establish a link on its publicly accessible Internet
8	website for dealers and other persons to download the firearm
9	safety manual.
10	(4) Develop audiovisual materials for use by certified
11	instructors to conduct firearm safety training.
12	(5) Solicit input from a reputable association or
13	organization, including a law enforcement association which
14	has as one of its objectives the promotion of firearm safety,
15	in the development of audiovisual materials and other
16	instructional materials.
17	(6) Prescribe a minimum level of skill, knowledge and
18	competency to be required of all firearm safety instructors.
19	(7) Develop guidelines to govern the certification of
20	persons as firearm safety training instructors.
21	(8) Develop guidelines to govern the issuance and
22	renewal of firearm safety certificates. The guidelines may,
23	at the discretion of the Pennsylvania State Police, require
24	the holder of the expiring or expired certificate to pass an
25	<u>objective test.</u>
26	(9) Develop a written objective test, prescribe the
27	objective test's content and the form and manner in which the
28	objective test may be administered by certified instructors
29	and make the objective test available to certified
30	instructors. The Pennsylvania State Police may establish a
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1	secure link on its publicly accessible Internet website for
2	certified instructors or other authorized persons to download
3	the objective tests.
4	(10) Develop procedures for the oral administration of
5	the objective test to persons with disabilities or language
6	barriers.
7	(11) Update objective test materials for firearm safety
8	training when determined appropriate, but not less than once
9	every five years.
10	(12) Require licensed dealers or employees of licensed
11	dealers who are also certified as firearm safety instructors
12	<u>under this subchapter to designate a separate room or</u>
13	partitioned area for a person to take the objective test and
14	maintain adequate supervision to ensure that no acts of
15	collusion occur while the objective test is being
16	administered.

3	weapons training instructor program, provided, however,
4	that a person's assignment as a range officer or safety
5	officer shall not be deemed sufficient for training
6	purposes.
7	(iv) The National Rifle Association or a sportsmen
8	<u>or gun club.</u>
9	(v) The Municipal Police Officers' Education and
10	Training Commission established under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21
11	Subch. D (relating to municipal police education and
12	<pre>training).</pre>
13	(vi) An accredited institution of higher education
14	in this Commonwealth which offers a class or course of
15	<u>study in firearm training or safety.</u>
16	(3) Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the
17	Pennsylvania State Police from automatically certifying a
18	person as a certified instructor, provided that the person
19	applying for the certification holds a valid firearm safety
20	certificate or firearms or weapons instructor certification
21	from an agency or organization under paragraph (2).
22	(d) Content of objective testThe objective test developed
23	by the Pennsylvania State Police for firearm safety
24	certification shall include, but not be limited to, the
25	following:
26	(1) The laws applicable to carrying and handling
27	firearms in this Commonwealth, particularly a firearm that is
28	<u>a handgun.</u>
29	(2) The responsibilities of ownership of firearms,
30	particularly a firearm that is a handgun.

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1	(3) Provisions of law which relate to the private sale
2	and transfer of firearms.
3	(4) Provisions of law which relate to the permissible
4	use of lethal force.
5	(5) What constitutes safe storage of firearms.
6	(6) Issues associated with bringing firearms into a home
7	with children, especially a firearm that is a handgun.
8	(7) Harm prevention strategies to address issues
9	associated with bringing firearms into a home.
10	(e) Firearm safety certificateThe Pennsylvania State
11	Police shall develop a firearm safety certificate to be issued
12	by certified instructors to persons seeking firearm safety
13	certification and who successfully passed a firearm safety
14	objective test in accordance with the requirements of this
15	subchapter. A firearm safety certificate shall include, but not
16	be limited to, the following:
17	(1) A unique firearm safety certificate identification
18	number.
19	(2) The holder's full name and date of birth.
20	(3) The holder's driver's license number or State
21	identification card number.
22	(4) The holder's signature.
23	(5) The signature of the issuing firearm safety
24	<u>instructor.</u>
25	(6) The date of issuance and expiration.
26	<u>§ 6195. Issuance of firearm safety certificate and objective</u>
27	test, renewal, fees and expiration.
28	(a) Compliance required for issuanceA certified
29	instructor shall not issue a firearm safety certificate to a
30	person who has not complied with this subchapter. Proof of
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1	compliance shall be forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police
2	by certified instructors in the form and manner and at the times
3	as the Pennsylvania State Police shall prescribe.
4	(b) Objective test required
5	(1) An applicant for a firearm safety certificate shall
6	successfully pass the objective test developed by the
7	<u>Pennsylvania State Police in accordance with section 6194(d)</u>
8	(relating to Pennsylvania State Police) with a passing grade
9	of at least 75%.
10	(2) An applicant who fails to pass the objective test
11	upon the first attempt shall be offered additional
12	instructional materials by the instructor, such as the
13	firearm safety manual, a videotape or instructional materials
14	as may be approved by the Pennsylvania State Police. The
15	following shall apply:
16	(i) A person may not retake the objective test under
17	any circumstances until 24 hours have elapsed after the
18	failure to pass the objective test upon the first
19	attempt.
20	(ii) A person failing the objective test on the
21	first attempt shall take another version of the objective
22	test upon the second attempt.
23	(iii) A person who fails the objective test on a
24	second attempt may not retake the objective test until
25	five days have elapsed after failure to pass the
26	objective test on the second and each subsequent attempt.
27	(iv) When feasible, all objective tests shall be
28	retaken from the same instructor except upon permission
29	by the Pennsylvania State Police, which shall be granted
30	only for good cause shown.

1	(v) The instructor shall make himself or herself
2	available to the applicant during regular business hours
3	in order to retake the objective test.
4	(c) Issuance of certificateA person receiving a passing
5	grade on the objective test in accordance with subsection (b)(1)
6	shall immediately be issued a firearm safety certificate by the
7	certified instructor. A certified instructor shall not issue a
8	firearm safety certificate to any person who is under 18 years
9	<u>of age.</u>
10	(d) Expiration and renewal of certificate
11	(1) Each firearm safety certificate issued under
12	subsection (b)(1) shall expire five years from the date
13	issued by the certified instructor.
14	(2) In the case of the loss or destruction of a firearm
15	safety certificate, the issuing instructor or the
16	<u>Pennsylvania State Police shall issue a duplicate certificate</u>
17	upon request and proof of identification to the certificate
18	holder. A duplicate firearm safety certificate shall be valid
19	for the balance of the unexpired term of the original
20	<u>certificate.</u>
21	(e) Fees
22	(1) In addition to a fee or charge which may be imposed
23	by a certified instructor for firearm training, each
24	certified instructor shall charge a fee of \$30 for the
25	issuance of a firearm safety certificate. Twenty dollars of
26	the fee shall be remitted to the Pennsylvania State Police
27	for deposit in the fund in accordance with subsection (f).
28	(2) A person seeking to renew an expiring or expired
29	firearm safety certificate may be required to pass the
30	objective test, as determined by the Pennsylvania State
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1 Police. For the renewal of an expiring or expired
2 <u>certificate</u> , each certified instructor shall charge a fee of
3 \$25, \$15 of which shall be remitted to the Pennsylvania State
4 Police for deposit in the fund in accordance with subsection
5 <u>(f)</u> .
6 (3) In the case of the loss or destruction of a firearm
7 <u>safety certificate, the Pennsylvania State Police may</u>
8 <u>authorize the issuing instructor to charge a fee of \$15 for a</u>
9 <u>duplicate certificate</u> , \$10 of which shall be remitted to the
10 Pennsylvania State Police for deposit in the fund in
11 accordance with subsection (f).
12 (f) Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund
13 (1) The Firearm Safety and Enforcement Fund is hereby
14 established as a restricted account in the State Treasury.
15 Money in the fund shall be expended by the Pennsylvania State
16 Police for the sole and exclusive purpose of administering
17 and enforcing this subchapter.
18 (2) The fund shall consist of all money received and
19 <u>deposited into the fund by the Pennsylvania State Police in</u>
20 accordance with subsection (e) and any interest thereon,
21 money which may be appropriated by the General Assembly and
22 any other contributions, payments or deposits which may be
23 <u>made available to the fund.</u>
24 <u>§ 6196. Violations and penalties.</u>
25 (a) Revocation of instructor certificateA violation of
26 this subchapter by a certified instructor may be grounds for the
27 Pennsylvania State Police to revoke the instructor's authority
28 to provide firearm safety training to persons seeking firearm
29 safety certification and to issue firearm safety certificates to
30 <u>those persons.</u>
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1	(b) Acts of collusion
2	(1) A person shall not commit an act of collusion as
3	specified in paragraph (2).
4	(2) For purposes of paragraph (1), an act of collusion
5	may include the following activities:
6	(i) Answering questions for an applicant taking the
7	objective test for firearm safety certification while the
8	objective test is being administered.
9	(ii) Knowingly grading an objective test for a
10	firearm safety certificate falsely.
11	(iii) Providing an advance copy of the objective
12	test to an applicant seeking firearm safety
13	certification.
14	(iv) Taking or allowing another person to take
15	firearm safety training for the applicant seeking a
16	<u>firearm safety certificate.</u>
17	(v) Taking or allowing another person to take the
18	objective test for the applicant seeking firearm safety
19	certification.
20	(vi) Using or allowing another to use an applicant's
21	identification for the purpose of obtaining a firearm
22	<u>safety certificate.</u>
23	(vii) Allowing persons to give an applicant for a
24	firearm safety certificate unauthorized assistance during
25	administration of the objective test.
26	(viii) Using unauthorized materials while taking the
27	objective test and cheating by the applicant.
28	(c) Additional violationsIt shall be unlawful for a
29	person to do any of the following:
30	(1) Alter, counterfeit or falsify a firearm safety

1 <u>certificate.</u>

2 (2) Use or attempt to use any altered, counterfeited or 3 falsified firearm safety certificate to purchase a firearm.

4 (d) Penalty.--A person who violates subsections (b) and (c)

5 <u>commits a misdemeanor.</u>

- 6 <u>§ 6197. Immunity from liability.</u>
- 7 <u>The Pennsylvania State Police shall be immune from any</u>
- 8 <u>liability which may arise from administering, implementing or</u>
- 9 enforcing any provisions of this subchapter.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
