insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on 1 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 2 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 3 4 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 5 6 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 7 8 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 9 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 10 11 through the Purchasing Fund.
