## AN ACT

Pennsylvania State Police. \* \* \* 9 10 (f) Notification of mental health adjudication, treatment, 11 commitment, drug use or addiction .--\* \* \* 12 13 (3) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the 14 Pennsylvania State Police [may] shall, within 72 hours of 15 receipt, disclose, electronically or otherwise, to the United 16 States Attorney General or a designee, any record relevant to a determination of whether a person is disqualified from 17

- possessing or receiving a firearm under 18 U.S.C. § 922 (g)
- 2 (3) or (4) or an applicable state statute[.], and any record
- 3 <u>relevant to a determination of whether a person is not</u>
- 4 <u>disqualified or is no longer disqualified from possessing or</u>
- 5 receiving a firearm under 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(3) or (4) or an
- 6 <u>applicable state statute.</u>

- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
