- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in criminal history record
- information, further providing for expungement.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 9122 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 8 § 9122. Expungement.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (c.1) Mistaken identity. -- The following shall apply to an
- 11 <u>individual who is the subject of the information and has been</u>
- 12 <u>arrested as a result of mistaken identity if no charges have</u>
- 13 been filed against the individual:
- (1) Not later than 90 days after an investigation by a
- 15 <u>law enforcement agency finds that an individual was arrested</u>
- 16 as a result of mistaken identity and no charges have been
- filed, the law enforcement agency whose officers made the
- 18 arrest shall petition the court for the expungement of the

- 1 <u>individual's criminal history record information made as a</u>
- 2 <u>result of mistaken identity, at no cost to the individual.</u>
- 3 (2) Not later than 90 days after receiving and reviewing
- 4 the petition under paragraph (1), the court shall order the
- 5 <u>expungement of all criminal history record information and</u>
- 6 <u>all administrative records of the law enforcement agency</u>
- 7 <u>relating to the individual's arrest as a result of mistaken</u>
- 8 <u>identity</u>.

- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
