## AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further 2 providing for definitions; in inchoate crimes, further 3 providing for prohibited offensive weapons; in assault, further providing for discharge of firearm into an occupied 5 structure; in theft and related offenses, further providing 6 for definitions; in riot, disorderly conduct and related 7 offenses, further providing for prohibiting of paramilitary 8 training; in firearms and other dangerous articles, further 9 providing for definitions, for persons not to possess, use, 10 manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms, for firearms 11 not to be carried without a license, for prohibited conduct 12 during emergency, providing for 3-D printed firearms, further 13 providing for sale or transfer of firearms, for firearm sales 14 surcharge, for registration of firearms and for licensing of 15 dealers. 16
