1 2 3 4	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, providing for a limit on handgun purchases; and establishing the Violence Prevention Account.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	<u>§ 6111.6. Limit on handgun purchases.</u>
10	(a) Purchase of handgunNo person may purchase more than
11	one handgun in this Commonwealth within any 30-day period.
12	(b) Sale of handgunNo person may sell or cause to be sold
13	to a person in this Commonwealth more than one handgun within
14	any 30-day period.
15	(c) ExceptionsThis section shall not apply to the
16	following:
17	(1) A licensed firearm dealer.
18	(2) A licensed firearm collector.
19	(3) A law enforcement agency or an agency authorized to

1	perform law enforcement duties.
2	(4) State and local correctional facilities.
3	(5) A private security company licensed to do business
4	within this Commonwealth.
5	(6) The purchase or sale of antique firearms.
6	<u>(7) A person whose handgun is stolen or irretrievably</u>
7	<u>lost if:</u>
8	(i) the person provides the seller with an official
9	copy of the police report of the lost or stolen handgun,
10	or a summary of the report on a form provided by the
11	<u>Pennsylvania State Police;</u>
12	(ii) the police report or summary contains the name
13	and address of the handgun owner, the description of the
14	handgun, the location of the loss or theft, the date of
15	the loss or theft and the date the loss or theft was
16	reported to the law enforcement agency;
17	(iii) the date of the loss or theft as reflected on
18	the police report or summary occurred within 30 days of
19	the person's attempt to replace the handgun; and
20	(iv) the seller attaches an official copy of the
21	police report or summary of the report to the original
22	sales receipt or other document evidencing the original
23	sale and retains it for the period prescribed by
24	regulation of the Pennsylvania State Police.
25	(d) Grading
26	(1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), a person that
27	is convicted of violating subsection (a) or (b) commits a
28	misdemeanor of the third degree.
29	(2) A person that, after being sentenced under paragraph
30	(1), is convicted of violating subsection (a) or (b) commits

1	a felony of the third degree.
2	(e) Disposition of fines collectedThe court imposing and
3	collecting a fine under subsection (d) shall transfer the fines
4	thus collected to the State Treasurer for deposit in the
5	account.
6	(f) Violence Prevention AccountThe Violence Prevention
7	Account is established within the General Fund as a nonlapsing,
8	restricted receipt account. Money in the account is hereby
9	appropriated on a continuing basis to the Pennsylvania
10	Commission on Crime and Delinquency exclusively for purposes of
11	violence prevention, including youth education and activities
12	designed to prevent violence and grants to law enforcement
13	agencies for equipment and training designed to prevent gun-
14	related injuries.
15	(g) NoticeA seller shall notify each prospective
16	purchaser that the purchase of more than one handgun in a 30-day
17	period is prohibited under this section and of the applicable
18	penalties.
19	(h) Handgun purchase history checkIn addition to any
20	other duty prescribed by this section, a seller of a handgun
21	shall request the Pennsylvania State Police to conduct a handgun
22	purchase history check to investigate whether the prospective
23	handgun purchaser is in compliance with this section. A handgun
24	purchase history check shall be conducted in accordance with the
25	procedures governing other background checks under this
26	subchapter. A handgun purchase history shall be conducted at the
27	same time any criminal history, juvenile delinquency or mental
28	health records check is required for a firearm purchase under
29	this subchapter. Information related to a handgun purchase
30	provided to the Pennsylvania State Police by a seller may be

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1	retained by the Pennsylvania State Police as necessary to
2	monitor compliance with this section.
3	(i) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
4	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
5	subsection unless the content clearly indicates otherwise:
6	"Account." The Violence Prevention Account established under
7	subsection (f).
8	"Handgun." Either of the following:
9	(1) A firearm that has a short stock and is designed to
10	be held and fired by the use of a single hand.
11	(2) Any combination of parts from which a firearm
12	described under paragraph (1) can be assembled.
13	"Licensed firearm collector." A person who collects firearms
14	and is licensed as a collector under 18 U.S.C. § 923 (relating
15	to licensing).
16	"Licensed firearm dealer." A person who is licensed as a
17	<u>firearm dealer under 18 U.S.C. § 923.</u>
18	"Purchase." Does not include the exchange or replacement of
19	<u>a handgun by a seller for a handgun purchased from the seller by</u>
20	the same person seeking the exchange or replacement within the
21	30-day period immediately preceding the date of exchange or
22	replacement.
23	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
