## AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, further providing for sale or transfer of firearms and for registration of firearms.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Sections 6111(b)(1.1)(v), (1.3) and (6) and
8	6111.4 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are
9	amended to read:
10	§ 6111. Sale or transfer of firearms.

12	(b) Duty of sellerNo licensed importer, licensed
13	manufacturer or licensed dealer shall sell or deliver any
14	firearm to another person, other than a licensed importer,
15	licensed manufacturer, licensed dealer or licensed collector,
16	until the conditions of subsection (a) have been satisfied and
17	until he has:

19	(1.1) On the date of publication in the Pennsylvania

Bulletin of a notice by the Pennsylvania State Police that the instantaneous records check has been implemented, all of the following shall apply:

5 [Unless it has been discovered pursuant to a (V) criminal history, juvenile delinquency and mental health 6 7 records background check that the potential purchaser or transferee is prohibited from possessing a firearm 8 pursuant to section 6105 (relating to persons not to 9 10 possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms), no information on the application/record of 11 12 sale provided pursuant to this subsection shall be 13 retained as precluded by section 6111.4 (relating to 14 registration of firearms) by the Pennsylvania State Police either through retention of the application/record 15 16 of sale or by entering the information onto a computer, 17 and, further, an application/record of sale received by 18 the Pennsylvania State Police pursuant to this subsection 19 shall be destroyed within 72 hours of the completion of the criminal history, juvenile delinquency and mental 20 21 health records background check.] The Pennsylvania State 22 Police shall retain information received from the 23 application/record of sale provided under this subsection 24 through retention of the application/record of sale or through entering the information contained in the 25 26 application/record of sale onto a computer. \* \* \* 27 28 (1.3) In addition to the criminal penalty under section

(1.3) In addition to the criminal penalty under section
6119 (relating to violation penalty), any person who
knowingly and intentionally maintains or fails to destroy any

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information submitted to the Pennsylvania State Police for purposes of a background check pursuant to paragraphs (1.1) and (1.4) [or violates section 6111.4] shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$250 per violation, entry or failure to destroy.

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7 (6) Unless it has been discovered pursuant to a criminal 8 history, juvenile delinguency and mental health records 9 background check that the potential purchaser or transferee 10 is prohibited from possessing a firearm pursuant to section 11 6105 (relating to persons not to possess, use, manufacture, 12 control, sell or transfer firearms), no information received 13 via telephone following the implementation of the 14 instantaneous background check system from a purchaser or 15 transferee who has received a unique approval number shall be 16 retained by the Pennsylvania State Police.

18 § 6111.4. Registration of firearms.

19 [Notwithstanding any section of this chapter to the contrary, 20 nothing in this chapter shall be construed to allow any 21 government or law enforcement agency or any agent thereof to 22 create, maintain or operate any registry of firearm ownership within this Commonwealth. For the purposes of this section only, 23 24 the term "firearm" shall include any weapon that is designed to 25 or may readily be converted to expel any projectile by the 26 action of an explosive or the frame or receiver of any such 27 weapon.] 28 (a) General rule.--Every person who owns, possesses,

29 purchases or otherwise receives ownership of a firearm under

30 section 6111 (relating to sale or transfer of firearms), or who

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1	brings or causes to be brought into this Commonwealth a firearm,
2	shall register the firearm with the Pennsylvania State Police
3	within seven days of acquisition of the firearm or within seven
4	days after the firearm is brought into this Commonwealth.
5	(b) Registration form
6	(1) Every person required to register a firearm under
7	this section shall submit registration on a form prescribed
8	by the Pennsylvania State Police. The registration form shall
9	be uniform throughout this Commonwealth and include the
10	following:
11	(i) The name, address, birth date, gender, race,
12	physical description and Social Security number of the
13	<u>registrant.</u>
14	(ii) The date of registration.
15	(iii) The caliber, length of barrel, make, model and
16	manufacturer's number of the firearm to be registered.
17	(2) Every licensed importer, licensed manufacturer or
18	licensed dealer who sells or otherwise transfers ownership or
19	possession of a firearm to a person shall provide the
20	registration form to the person receiving ownership or
21	possession of the firearm.
22	(3) The Pennsylvania State Police may retain information
23	received from the registration form through retention of the
24	registration form or through entering the information on the
25	registration form onto a computer.
26	(c) ConfidentialityAll information provided by a
27	registrant under this section, including the name or identity of
28	the potential purchaser, transferee or registrant, shall be
29	confidential and not subject to public disclosure, except as may
30	be required:

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1	(1) for processing the registration;
2	(2) by a law enforcement agency for the lawful
3	performance of its duties; or
4	(3) by order of a court.
5	(d) RenewalEvery person required to register a firearm
6	under this section shall renew the registration annually.
7	(e) Notification of changesThe registrant shall notify
8	the Pennsylvania State Police of any changes to the information
9	provided on the registration within seven days of the change of
10	information.
11	(f) Registration feeThe Pennsylvania State Police may
12	establish a fee by regulation to cover the reasonable and
13	necessary costs to develop and furnish the application and to
14	store the registration information required by this section.
15	(g) PenaltyAny person who violates this section commits a
16	summary offense.
17	(h) Rules and regulationsThe Pennsylvania State Police
18	shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement
19	this section, including regulations to ensure the
20	confidentiality and security of all records and data provided
21	under this section.
22	(i) Nonapplicability
23	(1) This section shall not apply to any of the
24	<u>following:</u>
25	(i) Firearms owned or possessed by a law enforcement
26	officer maintained or used in the course of the officer's
27	official duties.
28	(ii) Firearms lawfully owned, possessed or in the
29	custody of any Federal, State or local law enforcement
30	agency.
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1	(iii) Firearms sold or transferred between Federal
2	<u>firearms licensees.</u>
3	(iv) Firearms purchased or acquired by a chief law
4	enforcement officer or the officer's designee for the
5	official use of law enforcement officers.
6	(v) Firearms owned or possessed by a corrections
7	officer in the course of the officer's official duties.
8	(vi) Firearms in the lawful possession of a private
9	security officer in the course of the officer's official
10	duties for a private security company. The firearm must
11	be registered by the private security company.
12	(vii) Firearms owned or possessed by licensed
13	manufacturers or licensed dealers, bulk transporters or
14	licensed sellers at wholesale or retail, provided that
15	such persons have obtained all licenses as required by
16	Federal, State and local laws.
17	(viii) Firearms owned or possessed by any
18	nonresident of this Commonwealth participating in any
19	lawful recreational firearm-related activity in this
20	Commonwealth or in any other jurisdiction, provided that
21	the firearm shall be disassembled in a nonfunctioning
22	state and unloaded.
23	(2) As used in this subsection, the term "chief law
24	enforcement officer" means the Commissioner of Pennsylvania
25	State Police, the chief or head of a police department, a
26	county sheriff, the chief of police for a city of the first
27	class or any equivalent law enforcement official.
28	(j) ConstructionNothing contained in this section shall
29	be construed to make unlawful any act of a law enforcement
30	officer which is performed in the lawful performance of the law

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- 1 <u>enforcement officer's official duties.</u>
- 2 (k) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "firearm"
- 3 shall mean any weapon that is designed to or may readily be
- 4 converted to expel any projectile by the action of an explosive
- 5 or the frame or receiver of such weapon. The term does not
- 6 include antique firearms as defined in section 6118 (relating to
- 7 <u>antique firearms).</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
