AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 2 firearms and other dangerous articles, further providing for 3 licenses and for sale or transfer of firearms; and, in public safety, establishing the Shot Tracking Technology Grant 5 Program and the Shot Tracking Technology Grant Program Fund 6 and imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime 7 and Delinquency. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 6109(h)(1) of Title 18 of the 12 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the subsection 13 is amended by adding a paragraph to read: § 6109. Licenses. 14 15 * * * 16 (h) Fee.--17 (1)In addition to fees described in paragraphs [(2)(ii) 18 and] (3) and (3.1), the fee for a license to carry a firearm 19 is \$19. This includes all of the following: 20 (i) A renewal notice processing fee of \$1.50. (ii) An administrative fee of \$5 under section 14(2) 21

- of the act of July 6, 1984 (P.L.614, No.127), known as
- 2 the Sheriff Fee Act.

- 4 (3.1) An additional fee of \$10 shall be paid by the
- 5 applicant for a license to carry a firearm, including a
- 6 renewal of a license to carry a firearm, and shall be
- 7 remitted by the sheriff to the Shot Tracking Technology Grant
- 8 Program Fund established under 35 Pa.C.S. § 5903 (relating to
- 9 fund).

- 11 Section 2. Section 6111(b) of Title 18 is amended by adding
- 12 a paragraph to read:
- 13 § 6111. Sale or transfer of firearms.

- 15 (b) Duty of seller. -- No licensed importer, licensed
- 16 manufacturer or licensed dealer shall sell or deliver any
- 17 firearm to another person, other than a licensed importer,
- 18 licensed manufacturer, licensed dealer or licensed collector,
- 19 until the conditions of subsection (a) have been satisfied and
- 20 until he has:

- 22 (3.1) Charged each buyer or transferee a fee of \$1,
- which shall be transferred by the seller to the Pennsylvania
- State Police to be remitted to the Shot Tracking Technology

- 8 <u>§ 5901. Definitions.</u>
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 12 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
- 13 <u>Delinquency</u>.
- 14 "Eligible applicant." A municipality located within this
- 15 Commonwealth with a high rate of shootings.
- 16 "Fund." The Shot Tracking Technology Grant Program Fund
- 17 established under section 5903 (relating to fund).
- 18 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town,
- 19 township, home rule municipality, optional plan municipality,
- 20 optional charter municipality or similar general purpose unit of
- 21 government that may be created or authorized by statute or
- 22 school district.
- 23 "Program." The Shot Tracking Technology Grant Program
- 24 established under section 5902 (relating to program).
- 25 "Shot tracking technology." Technology that tracks the sound
- 26 of gunfire and provides the location of the shooting to police
- 27 officers.
- 28 <u>§ 5902</u>. Program.
- 29 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Shot Tracking Technology Grant</u>
- 30 Program is established within the commission as a competitive

- 1 program to award grants to eligible applicants.
- 2 (b) Purpose. -- The purpose of the program is to improve
- 3 <u>public health and safety in this Commonwealth through the</u>
- 4 <u>installation and maintenance of shot tracking technology in and</u>
- 5 around areas with a high rate of shootings, as determined by the
- 6 <u>commission</u>.
- 7 (c) Administration. -- The commission shall administer the
- 8 program.
- 9 (d) Public notice. -- The commission shall provide information
- 10 regarding the availability and award of grants under the program
- 11 on the commission's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 12 <u>§ 5903</u>. Fund.
- 13 (a) Establishment. -- The Shot Tracking Technology Grant
- 14 Program Fund is established in the State Treasury.
- 15 (b) Appropriation. -- All money deposited into the fund and
- 16 <u>interest earned on the money in the fund are appropriated to the</u>
- 17 commission on a continuing basis to award grants under the
- 18 program.
- 19 § 5904. Applications.
- 20 (a) Forms. -- The commission shall develop annual grant
- 21 application forms for eligible applicants that seek a grant
- 22 under the program. At a minimum, the forms shall contain the
- 23 <u>following information:</u>
- 24 (1) The name, address and contact information of the
- 25 <u>eligible applicant that seeks the grant.</u>
- 26 (2) The amount of the grant requested.
- 27 (3) The proposed use for the requested grant.
- 28 (4) If applicable, a detailed maintenance plan for any
- 29 <u>shot tracking technology installed with the grant.</u>
- 30 (5) Any other information that the commission deems

- 1 <u>necessary and appropriate.</u>
- 2 (b) Application period. -- Beginning no later than 180 days
- 3 after the effective date of this subsection, the commission
- 4 shall begin accepting and processing applications for grants
- 5 under the program. For all subsequent years, the commission
- 6 <u>shall establish an application period during which applications</u>
- 7 for grants under the program are accepted.
- 8 § 5905. Award of grants.
- 9 (a) Review.--After review of the information provided under
- 10 each eligible applicant's submitted application, the commission
- 11 shall determine whether to award a grant to the eligible
- 12 applicant and, if so, the amount of the grant awarded.
- 13 <u>(b) Allocation.--The commission may not:</u>
- 14 (1) Award a grant to an eligible applicant in excess of
- 15 \$25,000.
- 16 (2) Award grants in excess of the amount in the fund.
- 17 (c) Competitive nature of grants. -- Grants under the program
- 18 shall be awarded on a competitive basis to eliqible applicants.
- 19 In awarding a grant, the commission shall:
- 20 (1) Give preference to an eligible applicant whose grant
- 21 application demonstrates the greatest likelihood of reducing
- 22 the number of persons victimized by gun violence in that
- 23 municipality and neighboring communities.
- 24 (2) Consider the scope of an eligible applicant's
- 25 proposal and the demonstrated need for additional resources
- to effectively reduce gun violence in that municipality and
- 27 <u>neighboring communities.</u>
- 28 (d) Time periods.--
- 29 (1) The commission shall approve or denv an application
- 30 under the program no later than 60 days after the receipt of

- 1 the application.
- 2 (2) If the commission fails to approve or deny an
- 3 application under the program within 60 days after the
- 4 receipt of the application, the application shall be deemed
- 5 <u>denied</u>.
- 6 <u>(e) Notice.--</u>
- 7 (1) The commission shall provide written notice to an
- 8 <u>eligible applicant of the award or denial of the grant</u>
- 9 <u>requested in the eligible applicant's application.</u>
- 10 (2) Notice of the award of a grant under the program
- shall include the amount of the grant awarded and any
- conditions or restrictions on the use of the grant.
- 13 (3) Notice of the denial of all or part of a grant under
- the program shall include the reasons for the full or partial
- 15 <u>denial.</u>
- 16 <u>§ 5906. Reports.</u>
- 17 At least every three years, the commission shall prepare and
- 18 submit a report to the General Assembly regarding:
- 19 (1) The municipalities that received grants under the
- 20 program, including the amount of the grants and the intended
- 21 purposes of the grants.
- 22 (2) The number of municipalities that were denied a
- grant, in whole or in part, and the reasons for the denial.
- 24 (3) The rate of gun violence in municipalities that
- 25 received grants under the program.
- 26 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
