## AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, providing for the offense of possession of firearm or other dangerous weapon in public recreation area.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 914. Possession of firearm or other dangerous weapon in
10	public recreation area.
11	(a) Offense definedA person commits an offense if the
12	person:
13	(1) knowingly possesses a firearm or other dangerous
14	weapon in a public recreation area or knowingly causes a
15	firearm or other dangerous weapon to be present in a public
16	recreation area; or
17	(2) knowingly possesses a firearm or other dangerous
18	weapon in a public recreation area with the intent that the

firearm or other dangerous weapon be used in the commission
of a crime or knowingly causes a firearm or other dangerous
weapon to be present in a public recreation area with the
intent that the firearm or other dangerous weapon be used in
the commission of a crime.
(b) Grading
(1) An offense under subsection (a)(1) is a misdemeanor
of the third degree.
(2) An offense under subsection (a)(2) is a misdemeanor
<u>of the first degree.</u>
(c) ExceptionsSubsection (a) shall not apply to:
(1) The lawful performance of official duties by an
officer, agent or employee of the United States, the
Commonwealth or a political subdivision who is authorized by
law to engage in or supervise the prevention, detection,
investigation or prosecution of a violation of law.
(2) The carrying of rifles and shotguns by instructors
and participants in a course of instruction provided by the
<u>Pennsylvania Game Commission under 34 Pa.C.S. § 2704</u>
(relating to eligibility for license).
(3) Associations of veteran soldiers and auxiliaries or
members of the armed forces of the United States or the
Commonwealth, including reserve components, when engaged in
the performance of ceremonial duties with county approval.
(d) Private recreation areaNothing in this section shall
be construed to restrict the rights of the owners of a private
recreation area to implement policies relating to dangerous
weapons on a private recreation area.
(e) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

1	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
2	"Dangerous weapon." Any of the following when possessed with
3	intent to use or to provide to another to commit an offense
4	graded as a misdemeanor of the third degree or higher:
5	<u>(1) A bomb.</u>
6	(2) An explosive or incendiary device or material.
7	<u>(3) A grenade.</u>
8	<u>(4) A blackjack.</u>
9	(5) Metal knuckles.
10	<u>(6) A dagger.</u>
11	(7) A knife, the blade of which is exposed in an
12	automatic way by switch, push-button, spring mechanism or
13	<u>otherwise.</u>
14	(8) Any other implement for the infliction of serious
15	bodily injury which serves no common lawful purpose.
16	"Firearm." A weapon, including a starter gun, which will or
17	is designed to expel a projectile by the action of an explosion,
18	expansion of gas or escape of gas. The term does not include a
19	device designed or used exclusively for the firing of stud
20	cartridges, explosive rivets or similar industrial ammunition.
21	"Private recreation area." A park, recreation center or pool
22	owned or operated by a private entity.
23	"Public recreation area." A public park, recreation center
24	or a pool owned or operated by a political subdivision.
25	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
