AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school security, providing for
- 6 school safety form.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1314.1-C. School safety form.
- 13 (a) Notice. -- In accordance with this section, a school
- 14 entity shall provide written notice that the form under
- 15 <u>subsection</u> (b) was received from the employees of the school
- 16 entity or submitted by an employee of the school entity. A form
- 17 shall allow an employee granted a form under subsection (c) to
- 18 possess a firearm on the grounds of the school entity in the
- 19 course of the employee's official duties.
- 20 (b) Request form.--On a document prescribed by the

- 1 department, an employee of a school entity may submit a request
- 2 for a form to the chief school administrator of the school
- 3 <u>entity where the employee is employed.</u>
- 4 (c) Approval of request. -- Upon receipt of a request for a
- 5 form under subsection (b), the school entity shall, within 45
- 6 days, grant a school safety form to the employee if the employee
- 7 provides the following:
- 8 (1) Valid proof of employment by the school entity.
- 9 (2) A current full-face photograph that measures two
- inches by two inches.
- 11 (3) Proof of a valid license to carry firearms issued
- 12 <u>within this Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 <u>(4) A signed statement certifying that the employee</u>
- 14 <u>completed an in-person training and proficiency course for</u>
- the type of firearm the employee intends to carry on school
- 16 property. The statement must be provided by:
- 17 (i) an instructor certified by the National Rifle
- 18 Association in firearm instruction; or
- 19 <u>(ii) another instructor deemed competent to provide</u>
- the instruction by a judge of the court of common pleas
- 21 in:
- 22 (A) the jurisdiction where the instructor
- 23 <u>resides; or</u>
- 24 (B) the jurisdiction where the school entity is
- located.
- 26 (5) The statement under paragraph (4) is subject to 18
- 27 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to
- 28 authorities) and must demonstrate that:
- 29 <u>(i) the course provided training in:</u>
- 30 (A) the protection of students;

Τ	(B) interaction of license holders with first
2	responders;
3	(C) tactics for denying an intruder entry into a
4	<pre>classroom or school facility;</pre>
5	(D) safe handling and storage of weapons; and
6	(E) operating defensive weapons under duress;
7	(ii) the course included no less than 15 and no more
8	than 30 hours of instruction or as deemed appropriate by
9	an instructor under paragraph (4)(i) or (ii); and
10	(iii) the employee was required to demonstrate
11	hands-on safety and proficiency with the type of firearm
12	the employee intends to carry on school property.
13	(d) Photograph An employee granted a form shall annually
14	submit to the school entity a current full-face photograph that
15	measures two inches by two inches.
16	(e) List of individuals
17	(1) A school entity shall annually submit to the
18	Pennsylvania State Police and applicable municipal police
19	departments a complete list of the names with corresponding
20	photographs of the employees employed by the school entity
21	who have been granted a form. A copy of a submission under
22	this paragraph must be included in the district's emergency
23	preparedness plan under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7701(g) (relating to
24	duties concerning disaster prevention) and 22 Pa. Code Ch. 10
25	(relating to safe schools). A school entity shall coordinate,
26	including providing names and photographs, with its team
27	under Article XIII-E.
28	(2) Notwithstanding information provided by the school
29	entity to the Pennsylvania State Police or a municipal police
30	department under this subsection, a name, list, picture or

- 1 other information identifying the name, existence or identity
- 2 <u>of an individual certified under this act is confidential and</u>
- 3 not subject to access under the act of February 14, 2008
- 4 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law. A school
- 5 entity, person or State or local governmental agency or
- 6 <u>department that violates this section, resulting in the</u>
- 7 dissemination of confidential material to the public, is
- 8 <u>liable for civil damages in the amount of \$1,000 per</u>
- 9 occurrence or three times the actual damages incurred as a
- 10 result of the violation, whichever is greater, as well as
- 11 <u>reasonable attorney fees.</u>
- 12 (f) Storage. -- The secure storage of a firearm may only be
- 13 required if the individual is not carrying the firearm on the
- 14 <u>individual's body.</u>
- 15 (g) Definitions. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 16 <u>in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this</u>
- 17 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Chief school administrator." As defined under section 1301-
- 19 E.
- 20 <u>"Firearm." As defined under 42 Pa.C.S. § 9712(e) (relating</u>
- 21 to sentences for offenses committed with firearms).
- 22 "Form." A school safety form provided under subsection (c).
- 23 "License to carry firearms." A license to carry a firearm
- 24 issued under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6109 (relating to licenses).
- 25 "School entity." As defined under section 1301-E.
- 26 <u>"Team."</u> As defined under section 1301-E.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
