AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further 2 providing for definitions; in inchoate crimes, further 3 providing for prohibited offensive weapons; in assault, further providing for discharge of a firearm into an occupied 4 5 structure; in theft and related offenses, further providing 6 7 for definitions; in riot, disorderly conduct and related offenses, further providing for prohibiting of paramilitary 8 training; in firearms and other dangerous articles, further 9 providing for definitions, for persons not to possess, use, 10 manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms, for firearms 11 not to be carried without a license and for prohibited 12 conduct during emergency, providing for 3-D printed firearms and further providing for sale or transfer of firearms, for 13 14 firearm sales surcharge, for registration of firearms and for 15 16 licensing of dealers.

- 2 may not create a firearm or any piece or part of a firearm
- 3 without including a manufacturer's number.
- 4 (c) Penalty. -- The following shall apply:
- 5 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) shall be quilty
- of a felony of the third degree.
- 7 (2) A person who violates subsection (b) shall be quilty
- 8 <u>of a felony of the second degree.</u>
