Why You Should Care About the whole "Ghost Gun" issue and the ATF Final Ruling

Building guns has always been an American pastime. Just like making clothing or a building a fire to stay warm, Americans have built their own guns to feed and protect themselves and their families since before there was the United States.

The recent <u>ATF "Final Ruling"</u> should be of great concern to any gun owner and any American that values individual Rights and Liberties. This ruling was surely made possible with the precedent set by classifying a bump stock as a "machine gun". The potential damage to our Rights and Liberties potentially

goes far beyond putting a number onto an 80% polymer lower or a piece of plastic.

Read words from the actual document:

Section III
A. Definition of "Firearm"

In the NPRM, the Department proposed adding a sentence at the end of the definition of "firearm" in 27 CFR 478.11 to reflect existing case law, providing that "[t]he term shall include a weapon parts kit that is designed to or may readily be assembled, completed, converted, or restored to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive." However, the proposed amendment was not intended to affect the classification of a weapon, including a weapon parts kit, in which the frame or receiver (as defined in the proposed rule) of such weapon is properly destroyed.

Have you ever built an AR-15? When will it be required to serialize a "receiver" and require a background check to buy an upper? The new ruling does make exception to "AR-15's" however, will that change on the next "final" ruling? As I say, mountains are moved one shovel full at a time or with dynamite; our Rights are being chipped away, one ruling at a time.

Likely this ruling will find resistance in the courts, but the lasting negative effects on law abiding gun owners is palpable.

The With House said it is "Cracking down on ghost guns – the weapon of choice for many violent criminals". Rather than enforcing existing laws and holding local elected officials accountable for releasing violent criminals back into society, it would rather fund an army of ATF agents to arrest you for owning a piece of un-serialized plastic rather than apprehend CRIMINALS that victimize citizens and commit crimes of violence.

So why the shift in narrative?

For many years the anti-liberty forces within and outside of government demonized AR-15's and semi-automatic "assault rifles". In years past, they vilified "undetectable" polymer striker fired pistols. So why this somewhat recent push on "Ghost Guns"? Over the last 2 years MILLIONS of Americans purchased their first firearm because they felt the need to protect their family and exercise their 2A Right to keep and bear arms.

The post-covid gun owners are not just conservative white guys or folks who wear olive drab and cammies. There are MILLIONS of new men and women from various backgrounds, races, and creeds that purchased MILLIONS AND MILLIONS of guns including AR-15's and striker fired polymer handguns over the past 2 years. The anti-Liberty forces are keenly aware that the traditional anti-gun rhetoric could now, more than ever, backfire on them at the polls in November.

So why target such a small subsection of "firearm" owners by waging a war on personally made firearms (PMF's)?

Less Americans will feel a direct effect on their Rights. New post covid gun owners are likely not aware of the process of building guns, or the history and tradition of gun building, and not know how much work, time and money goes into building your own gun. It is certainly not a cost saver. Therefore, less of those new post-covid gun owners will bat an eye.

Words matter. The language that is defined, redefined, and re-interpreted in this new "final ruling" could later be expanded and re-defined, and re-interpreted to mean AR uppers, pistol slides, and even muzzleloaders. Will you someday need to be an authorized gunsmith or manufacturer to do a stipple job on a pistol or change out a barrel, or mount an optic?

Pay close attention to this and all the other things that are going on federally. If you own ANY gun or press a trigger, you should care about the restriction, limitation or banning of ANY GUN OR GUN RELATED ITEM. It should matter to all of us.

Firearms Owners Against Crime Institute for Legal, Legislative, and Educational Action (FOAC-ILLEA) has filed suit in the

Commonwealth Court against the Pennsylvania State Police

As a result of substantial delays in the processing of background checks for the purchase/transfer of firearms and for licenses to carry firearms, <u>Firearms Owners Against Crime Institute for Legal, Legislative and Educational Action</u> (FOAC-ILLEA) secured the services of Chief Counsel <u>Joshua Prince Esq</u> and attorney <u>Dillon Harris Esq</u> of <u>Firearms Industry Consulting Group (FICG)</u>, a division of <u>Civil Rights Defense Firm, P.C.</u>, and filed suit against the Pennsylvania State Police (Docket Number 281 MD 2022).

The Pennsylvania State Police directly infringes upon and often delays, due to PSP Commissioner Evanchick's practices and policies, the Rights of lawabiding Pennsylvanians and business owners by forcing citizens to submit to the antiquated and cumbersome Pennsylvania Instant Check System (PICS) so that they can gain permission from the government to exercise their most basic Constitutional Rights; to be armed and to bear arms.

As set-forth in the lawsuit, PSP Commissioner Evanchick has instituted a practice, in direct defiance of the General Assembly's mandate. Our general counsel, Josh Prince, has been quoted: As set-forth in the lawsuit, PSP Commissioner Evanchick has instituted a practice, in direct defiance of the General Assembly's mandate, that purposely understaffs the PSP's Instant Check Unit by only employing two PSP officers and a number of civilians (less than 90) as operators for conducting almost 1.5 million background checks per year, resulting in delays, as admitted by the PSP on its own website, that typically exceed 7 hours, and in some occasions, exceed 34 hours, even though the statutes require the background check system to be "instantaneous." As a result of Commissioner Evanchick's practice, numerous individuals have been disenfranchised of their statutory and constitutional rights under the Pennsylvania and U.S. Constitutions and therefore, we are seeking not only declaratory relief that Commissioner Evanchick's practice is unlawful, but additionally an injunction requiring the PSP to comply with the General Assembly's mandate that the background check system be instantaneous.

FOAC-ILLEA President, Kim Stolfer, says; we have been tracking and interacting with the legislature since 1998. The futility of decades of lobbying has ended up leaving us 'no choice' but to file this legal action! If we are interested in solving this problem and restoring system integrity then we simply cannot rely on the bureaucratic leadership of the Pennsylvania State Police and must seek the intervention of the courts.

So, the question that's been posed to me to answer for this article is... who am I?



That sounds like an easy reply when you first think of it, and then you realize that each and every one is us is a muti-faceted mix of experiences. I suppose I'm a father, husband, police officer, veteran, firearms enthusiast, car guy, and Constitutionalist all rolled into one. So how did I get here?

My father was a Vietnam veteran, and my

youth was filled with moments of wearing his uniform for Halloween and studying military history at a very early age. From Collier's Yearbooks that focused in great detail on World War II to arguing with high school hippie leftover teachers that the American soldier actually WON the Vietnam conflict, back to Alexander the Great and his defeat of Darius at Gaugamela (my high school paper). Military history was king with me.

At 17 I enlisted in the Air Force, (my first oath to the Constitution) turning down offers to fly helicopters in the Army or be a nuclear engineer on a sub in the Navy. I chose to be a security specialist in the Air Force, falling for the recruiter's line that I'd have plenty of time to study for my college courses and attain my commission. They assigned me to a nuclear weapons security role. The goal was flying F-15's... and boy did I approach that all wrong. When the Berlin Wall was taken down, the commissioning programs went away and I was left serving out the remainder of my 6 year term with no hope of achieving that goal.

The advantage though was I carried M-60's and M-203's almost daily and went to school after school the Air Force wanted me to attend. Those included some advanced combat courses, sniper school, and assignments to specialized units, with some short deployments to some unfriendly environments. I served and mustered out at 23.

From there a short stint with armored trucks led me to starting a career in law enforcement, (second and then third oaths to the Constitution) and now 28 years later I'm about to retire from a great department that has taken care of me and my family for a long, long time. I've experienced things most people will never see in their lives, some good some bad, but it's enabled me to help mostly good people for nearly three decades.

I bought my first privately owned rifle (an HK-91 I still own) with my first tax return in the Air Force for \$600 in 1989. From there I enjoyed gun clubs in the service, and friends and family alike who've experienced most of what the firearms world has to offer. My interest in firearms helped me to meet several members of F.O.A.C. along the way that piqued my interest in applying my oaths to the Constitution to defending our rights. Adding my law enforcement education to my interest in gun related topics, my strong belief that the Constitution supersedes all, and before you know it I'm a life member and on the Board of Directors. I've run my own firearms business for six years now from my kitchen table, review the legislation proposed in both Pennsylvania and Washington D.C. daily, and now after Kim Stolfer's influence, travel western Pennsylvania representing our organization teaching concealed carry seminars with a merry band of men and woman educating citizens and politicians alike. All to further the cause we, as an organization, have advancing the 2nd Amendment.

So that's me... gun enthusiast, Constitutionalist, public servant, and all around busybody... and I thank those of you who've put your faith in me to make a difference.

Article V Constitutional Convention UPDATE By Dr. Charles Gallo, 1St VP FOAC-ILLEA



I want to thank all those who responded to and re-circulated the April 12th <u>action</u> <u>alert by FOAC-ILLEA</u> to oppose resolutions in the Pa State Senate calling for an Article 5 Constitutional Convention.

The resolutions at issue were SR67, SR 152 and SR 227. Thanks for taking an action step and contacting the Pa Senators to voice your opposition.

The last actions on the resolutions are as follows: SR67 (Supreme Court at 9) were

reported out of State Government Committee on 12/14/2021, SR 152 (COS) was reported out of State Government Committee on 2/7/2022, SR227 (Term limits) was referred to Intergovernmental Operations on 2/18/2022, and SR127 (also Term Limits) was referred to State Government Committee on 6/9/2021. Please continue to contact the Senators to express your opposition. Those voted out of committee SR67and SR152 need special emphasis so that they will not be brought up on a Senate vote. 
